e is such a good teacher!" This phrase is the ambition of all teachers engaged in education, especially in a Bible school. Not so much for mere personal gratification, as important as that is, but because a good teacher succeeds in facilitating the learning of content, concepts and methods and, above all, in generating in the students a passion for the subject taught. If we have been blessed with such teachers, we understand how crucial this ability is.

As believers, we all have an extraordinary teacher, namely, the grace of God! Paul writes precisely this in his letter to Titus: "For the grace of God has appeared, bringing salvation for all people, training us to renounce ungodliness and worldly passions, and to live self-controlled, upright, and godly lives in the present age" Titus 2:11-12. We often think of grace as God's unmerited favour that gives us forgiveness and makes us His chil-

dren. Very true. But it does not end there! Using the Greek verb paideuō, the same root from which the English term pedagogy is derived, Paul emphasises that grace continually works by instructing and training us with patience and determination. This is because he is well aware that we are so radically contaminated by sin. We cannot untangle ourselves on our own. We can neither abandon ways of thinking, speaking and acting with our own wisdom, nor with our own resolve and strength. We need a guide to instruct us in our choices, correct us in our mistakes, and remind us of past experiences in order to learn from them. Growth, in fact, is not a linear process, in any sphere of life. It is a tangled zig-zag full of imperfections, mistakes and new beginnings. In any case, grace knows how to make us grow and knows how to turn complicated situations into eternal blessings. Not only that, grace renews in us the passion to live a holy life and the passion for this God who loved us and gave

himself for us (see Titus 2:13ff, full of magnificent and wonderful truths). Of course, this grace is an expression of our God, the Teacher par excellence, who through the Lord Jesus working in us by His Spirit, makes our growth towards holiness and maturity a reality for every disciple who is willing to learn.

Holiness and maturity are precisely one of the couplets that express the values we embrace at IBEI. Indeed, we want every student and staff member to grow "in holiness, that is, one's own moral virtues and consecration to God, through study, practical service and community interaction. This growth aims to be balanced, to involve the whole person, and to result in a solid personal maturity" (from our Ethical Values www.ibei.it/en/ in_a_nutshell/). As teachers, we wish to assist God's grace to facilitate the growth of our students, knowing that we ourselves are still in formation, in the school of grace!

After landing in Romania, our group split up for the first two days: a couple of students stayed in Romania while the rest of the group went to Moldova. The guys in Romania offered practical help at the warehouse of the missionary centre, which collects

and sorts basic necessities for Ukraine and for the needy Romanians. The rest of us who went to Moldova had the opportunity to deliver bags of food directly to families and individuals in the small community of Niorcani, a town that appears to be forgotten by everyone, like

many others in this nation. We also had the opportunity to run a programme for local children, and to encourage the people we met. What did we take away from this trip? The faces of the people we served! But most of all, we saw God at work through us, miserable earthen vessels. We appreciated how in the darkness of a forgotten village, the light of Christ can penetrate, illuminate and warm hearts. We went to offer help and encouragement. We thank God for this opportunity!

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text of the last book of the Bible in the light of broad considerations about the text itself and related texts. Very of-

ten, in fact, in biblical exegesis we suffer from an approach that focuses on detail, on individual verses and words, but loses sight of the whole, the sum total of words and verses. This approach is as widespread as it is damaging to Revelation. The details intrigue and enchant us, but at the same time confound and delude us, derailing and misleading us because we approach them unaware of their big picture. And it is precisely

analysing this bigger picture that lies at the heart of this magazine. The reader, therefore, does not have in his hands a commentary on the Apocalypse, nor even a complete study manual. Rather, a tool, nourished by centuries of interpretative history with all its successes and failures, that offers valuable considerations on the literary genre, style, keys to reading, and principles to keep in mind in the interpretation and teaching of this book.


